GFWC Signature Program: Domestic & Sexual Violence Awareness & Prevention and Health & Wellness CSP.


3rd place, Category 2:





HEALTHY START

sprang into action—holding book drives, collecting donations, and sometimes even going door-to-door to rally support. In many towns, clubwomen personally staffed and managed reading rooms until towns could afford to take over. Their determination paid off: by the early 20th century, GFWC was credited with establishing over 75% of the public libraries in communities nationwide.

GFWC History & Legacy

One of the most remarkable—and often overlooked—chapters in GFWC history is its foundational role in creating and expanding access to public libraries in the United States.

In the late 1800s, when the General Federation of Women's Clubs was first established, most

communities, especially in rural areas, had little or no access to books or educational resources. Recognizing the power of literacy and learning, GFWC clubs made it their mission to bring books to the people.

Local clubs across the country

These efforts weren't just about books—they were about empowering individuals, strengthening communities, and promoting lifelong learning. GFWC clubwomen believed that everyone deserved access to knowledge, and they worked tirelessly to make that belief a reality.

So the next time you step into a local library, remember—you're walking into a piece of GFWC's living legacy.
